THE RACE

Keeping the elegance and passion of the 1000 Miglia intact, the Coppa delle Alpi is the winter regularity competition for historic cars that winds through the most evocative passes of the entire Alpine arc and which will take place from 1 to 4 March crossing the borders of Italy, Switzerland, Germany and Austria.

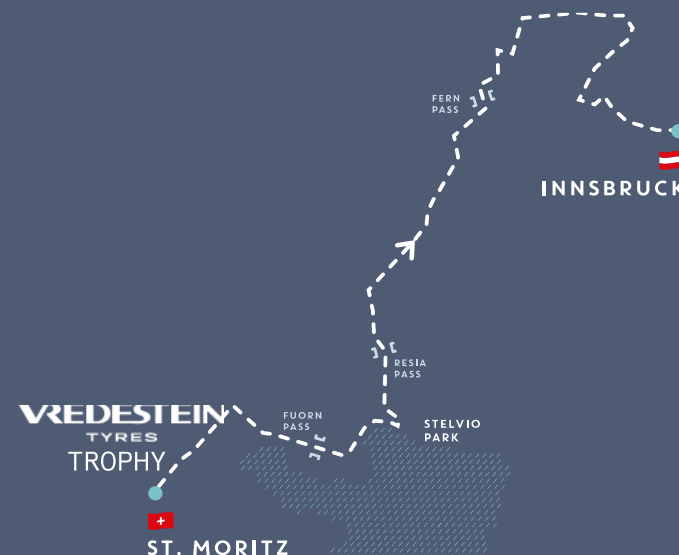

TIRANO

The Tirano and Media Valtellina area is a **meeting point** between nature, history, flavours and traditions, with the bottom of the valley characterised by prestigious winter and summer tourist resorts.

Twelve municipalities enclosed in the heart of the valley **narrate the traditions** of the people who have passed through and inhabited it over the years: there are numerous sanctuaries, churches, palaces and historical sites such as towers, castles and medieval gates that make Tirano and Media Valtellina an appealing cultural destination.

In Tirano it is also possible to board the famous **Bernina Red Train** for a journey through breath-taking views, blossoming landscapes and snowy panoramas. Without forgetting that the Media Valtellina is a unique experience for sports activities, artistic and historical treasures and local food and wine specialities such as pizzoccheri and chisciöi.



ST. MORITZ

The uniqueness of St. Moritz makes it a **landmark** among Alpine resorts. A village at an altitude of 1856 metres, it is best remembered for having promoted “**skiing holidays**” for the first time in 1864 and for having hosted **two Winter Olympics**.

The resort in the heart of the Engadine is **one of the world’s most popular tourist destinations** in both winter and summer, but it offers more than just ski slopes, great hotels and the chance to enjoy sports such as sailing, rowing, windsurfing, kitesurfing, tennis, miniature golf and horse riding.

St. Moritz is also known for being a **thermal bath source** for over 3 thousand years, not to mention the luxurious spas that characterise the area. All this makes St. Moritz a reference point for wellness at any time of the year.



INNSBRUCK

An ancient Habsburg residence, nestled on the banks of the Inn and surrounded by mountain peaks, Innsbruck is the **ideal destination** for a holiday amidst history, nature and sport: a perfect mix that makes this city the "capital of the Alps".

Innsbruck, famous for both its golden roof and the Olympic ski jump built in 2021, has always been a destination for winter sports and is also known for its imperial and modern architecture.

Also not to be missed is the Nordkette cable car, with its futuristic stations designed by architect Zaha Hadid, from the city center it climbs up to 2256 m in height, transporting skiers in winter and hikers or mountaineers in the warmer months.



BRESSANONE / BRIXEN – ALTO ADIGE / SUD TIROL

The oldest town in the Tyrolean region retains important traces of its past. Over the course of time, it was a **stopover on the travels of emperors** and became a **magnificent Episcopal seat**.

Brixen/Bressanone has enviable historical and architectural beauties: the square in front of the cathedral, the medieval old town, the arcades and decorated streets, the museum treasures, the craft tradition and the archaeological finds.

Bressanone is also a **university town**, home to the Academic Theological Study at the Episcopal Major Seminary of Bressanone (since 1607) and, since 2001, to the Faculty of Education of the Free University of Bolzano.

Finally, it is worth mentioning that Brixen is one of the most popular **tourist destinations** in the Alps. The Plose ski resort is only 7 kilometres from the city centre. Here, tourists can enjoy **43 kilometres of slopes** and a **breath-taking view of the Dolomites**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



BORMIO

Nestled in the heart of the Alps, the historic centre of Bormio preserves an **important artistic heritage**. Among the most significant testimonies to its past are the **towers**, according to documents there are 32 throughout the territory, symbols of power for the families that built them. Among these are the Alberti tower, the one attached to Palazzo Simoni and the Kuerc tower, in Bormio's central square.

Thanks to its geographical position and architecture, the municipality in the province of Sondrio is reminiscent of fairy-tale landscapes. With an altitude of more than 1200 metres, Bormio is often covered in a white blanket of snow in winter, making it **suggestive** to walk through the snow-covered streets of the historic centre or admire the lights of the town from the many panoramic terraces. Bormio, with its Stelvio ski slope, will host the 2026 Winter Olympics (Milano Cortina 2026).

Finally, it is worth mentioning the **thermal baths of Bormio**, already known in antiquity for their curative properties.
