

SORRENTO



Sorrento, the heart of the event and point of departure and arrival on race days, is built on the cliff that separates it from the characteristic harbour, and in its historic centre there is a maze of narrow streets animated by bars, shops and typical craftsmen.

The stroll between Piazza Tasso, the Cathedral, the church of San Francesco with its renowned cloister, Corso Italia, the citrus groves and the seafront promenade facing the Bay of Naples will offer the participants a pleasant immersion in the town overlooking the sea.

Circumnavigate the Sorrento Peninsula to admire from the sea the spectacular inlets that characterise one of the most admired views in the world.



PAESTUM



An archaeological site recognised as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1998, Paestum was already in the 6th century BC an important trading centre of Magna Graecia known as Poseidonia, in honour of the god Poseidon.

Excavations to discover the archaeological site brought to light many artefacts that can be admired together with several temples, monuments, and the forum in a journey through time to discover the ancient civilisations of the Mediterranean and their important legacy.



THE AMALFI COAST



The Amalfi Coast, characterised by an unrivalled gastronomic tradition, small towns overlooking the sea and a priceless historical heritage, stretches from Positano to Vietri sul Mare.

With its high cliffs, enchanting coves and small bays, terraces of citrus fruits, vines, olive groves and craftsmen's workshops, it is included in the UNESCO World Heritage List as a perfect example of a Mediterranean landscape with a setting of great cultural and natural value.




CAPRI



Refined and exclusive, Capri enjoys the enviable position opposite the Sorrento peninsula and the uniqueness of its landscapes characterised by the steep terrain towards the blue sea. Since the time of the ancient Roman Empire, the island was considered a place of great appeal and today it is one of the most popular destinations for international tourism, not only for the dramatic beauty of its jagged coastline and the sea caves that open up in the rocks, but also for glamorous but relaxed the atmosphere that one breathes in its small centre.


