From East to West, from Trieste to Courmayeur, across the borders of Italy, Slovenia, Austria, Switzerland, Lichtenstein, Germany and France. The participating cars, limited to a maximum number of 30, will face 5 days of racing during which they will cross the Alpine chain before arriving in Courmayeur where The Great Alpine Journey will end with a Forum, the summary of the ideas and contributions collected every day in the transition workshops, in the local meetings with the stakeholders, reference figures of the different territories crossed and involved in the project's themes.

TRIESTE - CORTINA D'AMPEZZO CIRCA 370KM

- Passing through Comeglians, one of the 7 municipalities involved against the depopulation of the Terre Alte (High Lands)

Departure from Trieste, in the direction of Slovenia, arriving first in Tolmin, Alpine Town 2016 "for its enhancement of the natural and cultural heritage" and then in Kranjska Gora, a cutting-edge municipality in waste and water management, energy saving, territorial planning and management of greenery. Back to Italy, passing through Tolmezzo, Alpine Town 2017 for its "particular attention to relations with the surrounding area"; arrival in Cortina d'Ampezzo, which through the Cortina Thinks Green project has been using 100% Green certified energy for its ski facilities for some time now.

Departure from Cortina d'Ampezzo towards Val Badia, which obtained the GSTC (Global Sustainable Tourism Council) certification in 2022, thanks to initiatives aimed at encouraging responsibility towards the territory and hospitality. Entry into Austria, with destination Innsbruck, leading city of the Tyrolean Clean Alpine Region project, and arrival in Seefeld in Tirol, where the first hydroelectric plant with zero environmental impact is located, as it uses purified waste water to produce energy.



SEEFELD IN TIROL - ST MORITZ CIRCA 370KM

Departure from Seefeld in Tirol, to Garmisch in Germany, the town that presented the **Nachhaltigkeitsstrategie** in 2020, a systemic strategy for sustainable economic development and demographic change; back to Austria, with the final leg in St. Moritz (Switzerland), the first ski resort in the world to use only recycled water for snowmaking.



ST MORITZ - GSTAAD CIRCA 395KM

Departure from St. Moritz in the direction of Lake Zurich and after passing through Liechtenstein for a short stop in Vaduz, the lunch break will take place in the picturesque city of Lucerne at the Swiss Museum of Transport. The leg will end with the arrival in Gstaad.




GSTAAD - COURMAYEUR CIRCA 160KM

Departure from Gstaad, with entry into France, in Chamonix, home of the CREA (Centre de Recherches sur les Ecosystemes d'Altitude) and Alpine Town 2015, thanks to measures to protect the territory and Passing through the Mont Blanc Tunnel cooperation policies with nearby Gstaad, Grindelwald, Valtournenche and Courmayeur. Final leg in Courmayeur, where the local council, within the framework of the Courmayeur Climate HUB, is implementing measures to reduce traffic in the valleys and the work of monitoring and studying glaciers.
